
NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION MUNICIPALITY OF THAMES CENTRE WATER AND WASTEWATER MASTER PLAN UPDATE

What is this study all about?

The Municipality of Thames Centre is completing the Water and Wastewater Master Plan Update. This update aims to develop and evaluate water and wastewater servicing strategies to meet potential population and employment growth within the Dorchester and Thorndale communities. This is a critical component in the integrated planning process and provides the framework and vision for the water and wastewater servicing needs for Thames Centre.

How was this study undertaken?

This study was undertaken in accordance with Approach 1 of the Master Planning process as set out in the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is an approved process under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. This approach involves the preparation of a master plan document at the conclusion of Phases 1 and 2 of the Class EA process.
