their differences and applauded and encouraged to be their authentic self. Hope that families before them, struggled and persevered. As a family that holds 2 degrees and a diploma from two London Secondary Schools, I would love nothing more then to help shape the futures of our newcomers by helping our city be better equipped and aware of their hesitations and reservations, building bridges to close the gaps and opening new chapters of support all found within our city.
