

Re: Staff report: Sherwood Forest Public School - Stakeholder Consultation Process

We would like to thank you and city staff for exploring with our community the concept of the redevelopment of the Sherwood Forest Public School Site. Staff have been very forthcoming with their time over a very short time period.

We ask Committee and Council to make an offer to purchase this site so that we may begin the work with city staff to bring this evolution of our neighbourhood to realization.

- We believe there is strong potential for community support for an infill redevelopment that retains approximately 1 hectare of public park space and up to 25 housing units.
- Both our Executive and the Sherwood Forest School Site Committee have been part of the
 consultation process with City staff. We believe that redevelopment can be achieved that meets
 the objectives and best interests of both the City and residents: retention of parkland, housing
 with Urban Design features that fit with the neighbourhood, consistency with the Great Near
 Campus Neighbourhood policies of Council, and advancement of the City's Strengthening
 Neighbourhoods Strategy.
- The successful conclusion of a quality redevelopment supported by Council through a collaborative process with the community, retaining part of the site for parkland, could result in a quicker redevelopment, without contention, that would be a positive for all.
- Importantly, this could serve as a model for other infill sites in the City.
