A Caring Community:

 London is a community where people look out for one another and where a helping hand is never far away. We are a safe community where people know their neighbours and take pride in their neighbourhoods. We are a city with exceptional health care and social support networks that ensure the health and well-being of all Londoners.

Key Strategies:

- Increase the health and well-being of all Londoners
- Ensure affordability and accessibility in all areas
- Provide effective and integrated community based social and housing supports
- Support individuals at all stages of life, from newborns to the elderly, and from newcomers to the established
- Promote safety in all neighbourhoods
- Promote public awareness through prevention programs

Key Departmental Multi-Year Strategies

- All of these strategies have been endorsed by City Council and/or approved by the Province and are in full implementation, subject to annual budget approvals.
- The Administration will be providing regular progress reports and updates on all of these strategies.
- Many of these plans have been funded through savings within your social spending envelope – upstream investments to save downstream costs:
 - ODSP Upload \$23M./yr \$1.2M per year for five years re-invested in London CAReS
 - Wind down of \$2M/yr basic needs support program (NCBS) as a result of introduction of the Ontario Child Benefit - \$600K/yr investment in the Child and Youth Agenda



Key Departmental Multi-Year Strategies

- For 2012 new OW funding formula savings of \$4.5M/yr Request for:
 - \$500K/yr for Child and Youth Agenda implementation
 - To offset loss of reserve fund contributions(\$300K)
 - to launch Neighbourhood Child and Family Centres (\$200)
 - \$300K/yr for community development work in LMHC communities
 - 500K /yr to fund deficit in OW Child Care spaces
 - \$200K/yr to cover growth costs associated with parks maintenance
 - \$100K/yr for implementation of the Strengthening Neighbourhoods Strategy.
 - Business cases have been reviewed by the SRC
 - Remaining \$2.9M has been applied to reduce the City budget.



Key Challenges/Opportunities/Decisions for Committee in 2012

Housing

- Implementation of the Community Housing Strategy
 - Continuation of \$2M per year allocation of municipal funds to leverage provincial and private sector matching funds to meet targets
- Implementing <u>Housing Services Act 2011</u>
 - New policies, procedures and local rules

Social Services

- New OW Employment Services Strategy
- Provincial Community Addictions and Mental Health Strategy
- OW in the Community
- Poverty Reduction
 - Social Assistance Review Commission Report
 - Citizen's Panel

Key Challenges/Opportunities/Decisions for Committee in 2012

Long Term Care (Committee of Management)

- Pressure to place patients exciting the RMHC pyschogeriatric ward without sufficient funding to manage care and safety issues.
- Potential funding threat, could reduce staffing and care levels.

Neighbourhood and Children's Services

- Child Care Wait List
- Full Day learning rollout impact on community agencies
