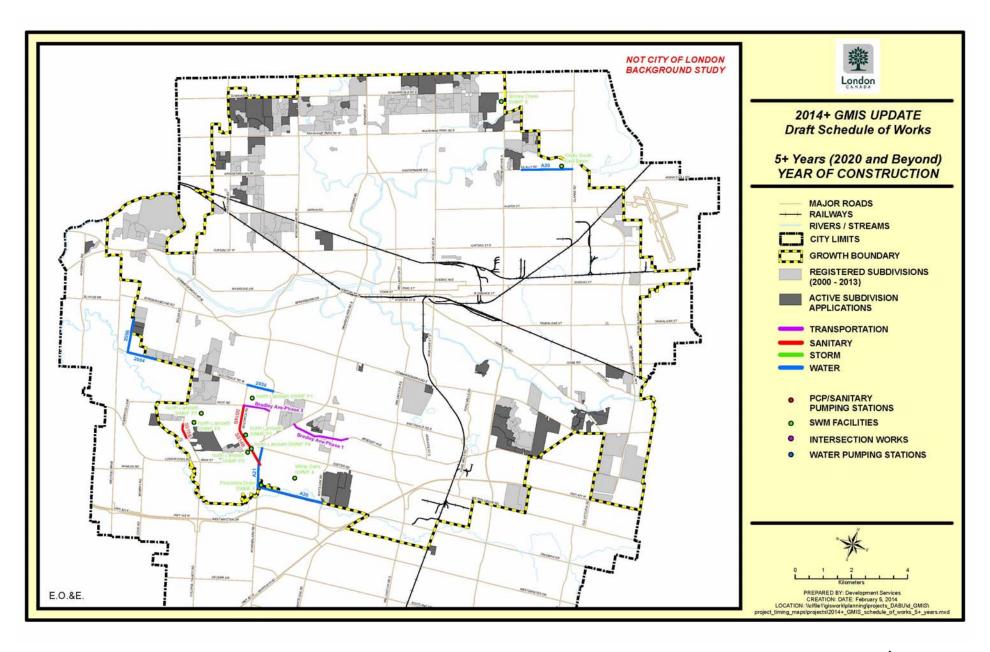
# Growth Management Implementation Strategy - 2014 Report

#### The GMIS:

- 8 key principles (see report).
- Aligns major servicing infrastructure with growth needs across Capital budgets.
- Allows Council to react to significant fluctuations in development charge revenues.

### Consultation

- Also provides an opportunity for the development community to comment on the timing of specific infrastructure projects.
- GMIS list was provided to the wider development community in early December.
- Feedback was received from various parties LDI members and otherwise.



## **Overall Synopsis**

- Developer requested timing has been generally accommodated.
- Accommodating this program puts upward pressure on the DC rate and needed DC financing.
- 2014 GMIS in general reflects the timing of items included in the draft tax supported budget and previously approved water and wastewater budgets.

#### SWM Debt Situation

- SWM facility timing existing reserve fund debt problem still exists.
- Council's Stormwater Management Design and Construction policy will partially mitigate these effects.
- Deferrals of SWM Facilities in future GMISs (including the 2015 GMIS) may be necessary.
