RECOMMENDATION

That, on the recommendation of the London Police Services Board, the following action be taken with respect to the Contractual Agreement and Schedules in relation to the Community Policing Partnership Program:

- (a) the <u>attached</u> by-law **BE INTRODUCED** at the Municipal Council meeting on July 28, 2014 to approve the agreement noted above between Her Majesty The Queen in Right of Ontario as represented by the Minister of the Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services, The Corporation of the City of London and the London Police Services Board; and,
- (b) the Mayor and City Clerk **BE AUTHORIZED** to execute the said agreement on behalf of The Corporation of the City of London.

PREVIOUS REPORTS PERTINENT TO THIS MATTER

Contract extensions have been executed in 2003, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2010, and 2012.

BACKGROUND

In November, 1998, the Province introduced the Community Policing Partnerships (CPP) Program. The program was initiated as a five year partnership between the province and municipalities where the Ontario Government provides fifty percent of salary and benefit costs to a maximum of \$30,000 per allocated officer. The program is intended to increase police presence and support targeted enforcement initiatives addressing high crime areas such as residential break and enters, vehicle thefts, crimes impacting neighbourhoods, and street crime. The London Police Service receives funding for 30 front-line officers representing annual revenue of \$900,000.

Contract extensions have been executed in 2003, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2010 and 2012. The current renewal is for the period from April 1, 2014 through March 31, 2016.
