## **BACKGROUND**

As directed by City Council and as a result of a competitive process through the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO), London is hosting the AMO General Meeting, Conference and Trade Show August 17-20 at the London Convention Centre. The AMO General Meeting, Conference and Trade Show is Ontario's foremost educational forum for municipal governments. The 2011 conference, hosted by the City of London and Middlesex County, attracted 2,600 participants including more than 1,600 municipal delegates, Ontario's Premier, both opposition leaders, many members of the Ontario Government's cabinet, Opposition critics, MPPs, and exhibitors.

The AMO Conference is an exceptional opportunity for the City of London to showcase its facilities and its assets. The 2011 conference generated an economic impact of approximately \$3.4 million to the city and this year's conference is expected to generate a similar impact.

As outlined in the City's agreement with AMO, the City of London, as host, is responsible for planning and financing the Mayor's Welcome Reception, study tours including busing, providing volunteers, and shuttle buses between hotels and the conference facility. The Local Planning Committee, with the assistance of an event planner is coordinating host-led arrangements for the conference.

Notwithstanding some sponsorship revenue and a hotel rebate, host conference expenses are expected to exceed \$112,000 and a contribution of up to \$70,000 will be required to fulfill our commitments to AMO and our delegates.
