3. Lake Cowichan, British Columbia – Nov 19, 2011 – 3000 people
4. Williams Lake, British Columbia – Nov 19, 2011 – 11,000 people
5. Lakeshore, Ontario – Oct 31, 2011 – 33,000 people
6. Churchill, Manitoba – October 16, 2011 – 1,000 people
7. Slave Lake, Alberta – Sept 12, 2011 – 7,000 people
8. Taber, Alberta – July 20, 2011 – 6500 people
9. Meadow Lake, Saskatchewan – July 4, 2011 – 5,000 people
10. Calgary, Alberta – Feb 8, 2011 – 1,300,000 people
11. Verchers, Quebec – Feb 7, 2011 – 5240 people
12. Waterloo, St Jacobs, Elmira, Ontario – Oct 25, 2010 – 103,000 people

1. 5.7% of the world has Fluoridated water
2. 3.8% of BC is Fluoridated
3. 6% of Quebec is Fluoridated
4. 0% Newfoundland, Labrador and Nunavut are fluoridated
