League of United Latin American Citizens Resolution July 1, 2011

- **WHEREAS**, current science shows that fluoridation chemicals pose increased risk to sensitive subpopulations, including infants, the elderly, diabetics, kidney patients, and people with poor nutritional status;
- **WHEREAS**, minority communities are more highly impacted by fluorides as they historically experience more diabetes and kidney disease;
- **WHEREAS**, minorities are disproportionately harmed by fluorides as documented by increased rates of dental fluorosis (disfiguration and discoloration of the teeth);
- **WHEREAS**, the election to fluoridate the water, essentially disenfranchised the right of these minority Districts to safe drinking water for all;
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that LULAC** demands to know why government agencies entrusted with protecting the public health are more protective of the policy of fluoridation than they are of public health.
