YOUR COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS:

Heritage Alteration Permit – Deluca – 559 Grosvenor Street

1. (20) That, on the recommendation of the Director of Land Use Planning and City Planner, with the advice of the Heritage Planner, the Heritage Alteration Permit Application of J. Deluca requesting permission for an alteration to the driveway of the designated heritage property located at 559 Grosvenor Street BE APPROVED; it being noted that the Heritage Planner has reviewed the proposed change and has advised that the impact of such alteration on the heritage features of the property identified in the reasons for designation is appropriate with respect to the Conservation Guidelines for the District; it being also noted that the LACH heard a verbal presentation from J. Deluca, 559 Grosvenor Street, with respect to this matter.

Demolition Applications – Heritage Properties

- 2. (Add) That the Civic Administration **BE ASKED** to undertake the following, with respect to demolition applications for heritage properties listed in the *Inventory of Heritage Resources*:
- a) implementation of the same administrative process that is used for minor variances applications, which is to send notification letters to adjacent property owners within a 60 metre radius; and,
- b) receiving a legal opinion related to the requirement to notify neighbourhood community associations of demolition applications;

it being noted that the London Advisory Committee on Heritage received the <u>attached</u> communication dated December 13, 2011 from M. Parks, Bishop Hellmuth Community Association, with respect to this matter.

Dear Members of LACH:

I am writing to you on behalf of the Bishop Hellmuth Community Association to bring to your attention the lack of notification we experienced in September related to a decision for a property in our Heritage Conservation District.

It was only by chance that I received an email from the Heritage Planner for the City informing me that LACH was meeting on September 14th to hear arguments for the demolition of 764 Waterloo Street. As a community we had no time to formulate a response or even be aware of the issues relating to this property since we were only informed a few days prior to September 14th.

I find this lack of communication to the community totally unacceptable. Application to the city for demolition had to have been presented to the Planning Division, City of London some time earlier in the summer, and your committee would have been informed about this.

Why is there not some procedure for notifying Heritage Conservation Districts when property in their area is to be destroyed? Relying on announcements of BNEC agenda in the London Free Press' Living in the City column does not inform the community as a whole. Only those who subscribe to the paper might have seen the announcement.

I would suggest that LACH and the Planning Department should develop a procedure for notifying Heritage communities when a property in the district is being considered for demolition. In the case of 764 Waterloo Street, with time, the Bishop Hellmuth Community Association would have been able to present a sound position for maintaining the building.

We look forward to better ways Heritage communities are informed of issues.
