Proposed Regulations

- Proposed new category in L-6 By-law
- Includes truck or trailer from which food products are sold and/or prepared
- Permitted on City streets
- City-wide, based on specific criteria
- #8 category 7 vehicles has been proposed as part of pilot project.



<u>Fees</u>

- \$3 565.00 (Category 7 Vehicle)
- Cost covers administration, enforcement, GPS.
- Parking rates/meters will have to be paid, where applicable.




Location Criteria

- Restricted to arterial, primary and secondary collector streets
- Only where on-street parking is permitted
- 25m buffer around restaurants and residential uses/users.
- 100m buffer around schools and festivals during operating dates/times.



Map depicting potential food truck locations in the Downtown based on location criteria.


