Skills: Although bilingual as a Native Azerbaijani speaker, I took Mandarin at Huron University. After learning basic Mandarin (speaking, writing in pinyin and characters), my interest in other cultures grew. Becoming more involved with cultural groups at the Western campus, I became aware of many basic problems that International students face. After volunteering as a Peer Guide, and as a current CLM (discussed under the "past contributions" section), I hope to continue contributing to diverse groups on a broader scale. I bring a lot of planning experience, and began event planning as early as 15. I have been the Co-Chair of the South London Youth Council, planning events in the South London region, and took this role to the London Youth Council, helping plan National Youth Week in London. As a previous Student Trustee for London, I helped plan the first Student Government Symposium in the City, collaborating with Student Government members across the city.

Interest reason: Although born and raised in London, ON, I am a first-generation Canadian. I have a deep connection with individuals new to Canada, and also Students on Exchange for University. I believe that this role will not only allow the opportunity to learn more about the problems of diverse, minority groups within London, but also to voice the opinions of International Students from UWO.

Contributions: As a very driven student, I am one to really get involved with organizations I am passionate about.
