# **BACKGROUND**

# **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to provide Committee and Council with:

- background information on the London Clean & Green Program, one of London's largest community collaborations, designed to first help 'clean" London in the spring and then help promote 'green' events, and
- highlight that the London Clean & Green Program is celebrating its 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

### **CONTEXT**



London Clean & Green had its start in 1996 when 30 people coordinated by Joe Kool's picked up litter and removed graffiti on a Saturday morning in downtown London. The program has grown in a number of ways from people and resources to program length and activities. Cleanup activities now attract between 5,000 and 10,000 people and events start in early April and go until late June.

Today, the London Clean & Green Program is a collaboration between individuals, community groups, businesses and the City of London. The 2015 edition marks 20 years of being in the cleaning and greening business, a significant milestone.

Celebrating 20 Years of Community Action for the Environment



#### DISCUSSION

### Highlights from 2014

In 2014 there was an increased focus on "cleaning" activities under the banner 12 Days of Cleaning. The goal was to make Londoners and businesses aware that there are numerous locations to drop-off items that may otherwise become litter and garbage (i.e., a focus on preventing the creation of litter, garbage and illegal dumping). Basically there is no excuse for items being littered or illegally dumped.



Estimates suggest that about 10,000 people volunteered their time between the 20 Minute London (Business) Makeover on April 25 and the Community Clean up on April 26. Between 16 and 20 tonnes of litter and garbage were collected from boulevards, parks, neighbourhoods and river banks. London Police Service also coordinated the removal of graffiti in a number of areas.

Key green events after the initial cleanups included:

- 21<sup>st</sup> Annual Earth Day London (Watson Park)
- Numerous tree plantings
- Grickle Grass Festival
- Environmental and sustainability movies
- Tree and plant sales
- Used Tire Collection
- Electronics recycling
- Gathering on the Green (Old South)
- Several cycling related events
- London Bike Festival
- Dundas Street Festival (downtown)
