


Thames Valley Parkway North Branch Connection Richmond Street to Adelaide Street Class Environmental Assessment Study



Public Information Centre #2

The Thames Valley Corridor is London's most important natural, cultural, recreational and aesthetic resource. The river corridor is a complex system of sensitive ecological habitats, intensive public recreation areas and developed urban lands which are all interconnected by a municipal pathway system.

This pathway system, known as Thames Valley Parkway (TVP) stretches along all three branches of the river converges in the downtown core. Connecting existing "gaps" in the TVP is a priority for the City. In the fall of 2014 the City initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) to address the existing gap in the north branch TVP between Richmond Street and Adelaide Street as well as secondary connections to area neighbourhoods. The study potential reviewed several alignments for the TVP, which were presented to the public in January 2015. The study team is



recommending the alignment that includes two pedestrian bridges over the Thames River, connecting to the existing TVP at Ross Park and North London Athletic Fields. Details regarding the evaluation and recommended alignment will be presented at the November 12 Public Information Centre.
