

Please include the following comments in the Agenda of the Planning Committee of December 14.

“ The citizens of London understand the will of the County of Middlesex to maximize the value of the land at 50 King st, London. but it should not be on the shoulders of the citizens of London. A similar proposal by the County was soundly rejected last year by the Council of London. It is time for the County of Middlesex to abandon their speculative agenda and work with the City of London for a solution that will satisfy both parties.

50 King is public land and it should be utilized for the benefits of the citizens of London and the County not for the benefit of the revenues of the County alone.

There is a project, Back to the River, currently being considered by the City of London. which will enhance the public nature of 50 King for the benefits of all.

I could see a Performing Art complex on the site of 50 King, not a high rise private building.

I urge the Planning Committee to vote down the application submitted by the County.
