


FLOODING MATTERS WORK PLAN PROPOSAL


















Phase 1

- HOMES -- What is the <u>insurance industry's tolerance</u> for repeat flooding incidents?
- HOMES -- How might the City support their risk model to the benefit of homeowners in <u>maintaining insurance coverage</u>?
- HOTSPOTS -- Without stigmatizing, where are the known localized flooding areas recorded to date that are a direct result of high intensity, short duration rainfall events?





Phase 1

- HOTSPOTS -- What are the <u>common elements</u> associated with known flooding locations?
- PROGRAMS -- What are the best strategies, methods, programs and communication tools used by others? How do we compare?
- PROGRAMS -- Can the City do a <u>better job communicating post</u> severe weather event information? If so, what kind of information is important to the citizens and what forums are most effective?





Communication / Consultation

With public locally before any construction – existing policy

Continued conversations with some particular property owners in order to use existing programs and funds.

Consult the public when there is an <u>area problem</u> – some hotspot work has <u>already been</u> initiated -- following up.

The Work Plan does not initially have any consultation -- first phase has a <u>fact finding / research mission</u>.

<u>Subsequent phases will carry consultation</u> appropriate to the issue – by-law change, hotspot, etc. Each report is public. <u>Meanwhile</u>, all the above is / will be occurring.
