### **Built Environment influences on AT**

### Significant positive:

- Intersection density ('connectivity')
- Land use mix
- Density of street trees

### Significant negative:

- Distance between home & school
- Number major streets crossed
- Traffic volume


### Mapping 'Risky' Spaces:

- Highest MVC concentrations in central core and major intersections
- Children injured more frequently in MVC "hotspots"
- HEAL/ASRTS do audits and 'walkabouts' to understand environmental elements associated with MVC risk (and *perceptions*) to identify policy and environmental interventions...

# **Monitoring Active Travel and Air Quality**


- Child's average PM<sup>2.5</sup> exposure during journey to school is <u>lower for walkers vs those</u> who are driven
- Traffic around schools has significant impact on children's exposure to pollution!




