



# Highbury Avenue/Hamilton Road Intersection Improvements Environmental Assessment Study



## Notice of Public Information Centre 2

The City of London retained Dillon Consulting Limited to complete a Schedule 'C' Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) Study for improvements to the Highbury Avenue/Hamilton Road intersection. Building on the City's 2030 Smart Moves Transportation Master Plan, the EA Study assessed the need for additional through and turning lanes on Highbury Avenue, improvements to the median on Hamilton Road and pedestrian and cyclist friendly design features. Changes in access to Highbury Avenue and Hamilton Road were also assessed. A map of the Study/Consultation Area is shown on the reverse.

### Public Meeting

Public input, including comments, questions and concerns are welcome throughout the study. A Public Information Centre will be held on **March 9, 2016**, to present the alternative designs developed for the intersection improvements, comparative evaluation of the alternatives and the preferred design option.
