Occupation: Librarian & Research Officer

Work experience: I have worked as a law librarian and research officer at a large London law firm since 2006. This work involves working with our lawyers and staff to provide information services. I work with them to understand their information needs, select resources to support their work and conduct research on their behalf as needed. Previously I spent several years working in agriculture. I spent several years working on large and small dairy farms in Ontario and the United States. I was involved in day to day management of the herd and general farm operations. Prior to my career as a librarian I worked in Taiwan and South Korea as an English teacher. As part of my education, I completed a co-op term working as a librarian at Environment Canada's Downsview office.

Education: I have a Master of Library and Information Science (MLIS) degree from Western (2007). As an undergraduate, I earned a Diploma in Agriculture (1998) and a BA (Hons) in Philosophy (2003) from the University of Guelph.

Skills: My work as a law librarian has given me experience in research and understanding laws and policies relevant to the Agricultural Advisory Committee, the Planning & Environmental Committee and the City Council. I excel at finding, assessing and presenting knowledge in a way that is clear and focused on problem solving.

Interest reason: I have an education and a strong interest in agriculture, urban agriculture, food security and health. I believe in making use of my skills and experience to make a positive contribution to my community. I also believe in citizen engagement and participation in government.
