# Biologic Wonderland Road Environmental Impact Study Prepared for Southside Group by BioLogic, February 18, 2016 EEPAC May 2016

#### **Deficiencies**

- 1) Section 4.1.4 Indicates that the development of the subject lands (east) will be located on a site with a "highly vulnerable aquifer" that is located as shallow as 3.96m below the surface. The EIS claims that the development will not pose a risk to the aquifer. However, the EIS fails to provide evidence to support their claim that the development will not breach or contaminate the aquifer. The risk of damaging the aquifer should also consider the number of residents that may use the aquifer as a source of drinking water because it is these residents that would be adversely affected if the aquifer is contaminated. The EIS does not provide any information regarding how the aquifer is used by local residents.
- 2) Section 4.2.1 Using outdated resources Criteria Schedules (MNRF, 2012). The current Criteria Schedule for EcoRegion 7E (2015) should have been used as they have been available since mid-2015.
- 3) Section 4.2.5 Fauna study and Appendix I, Amphibian Breeding Survey The Marsh Monitoring Program which is the accepted survey method, requires three surveys. The first in April, the second in May and the third in June under certain air temperature and wind conditions, 30 minutes after sunset. Appendix I reports only two proper surveys of the dug depression. The April survey is missing. It is possible this is Significant Wildlife Habitat as the survey could have identified Wood Frogs which can only be heard for a short time very early in spring calling in wet wooded areas.

#### Recommendations

- 1) The EIS should provide evidence to support the assertion that the development will not damage the highly vulnerable aquifer. In addition, the EIS should include information regarding the number of residents using the aquifer as a source of drinking water.
- 2) Use current Ministry documents to define significant wildlife habitat
- 3) An April amphibian breeding survey should be required to determine if the dug depression is significant Wildlife Habitat
- 4) Figure 8: Development Proposal parking lots adjacent to maintained hydro corridor provide a 5m vegetated buffer between parking spaces and hydro corridor to be planted with native, non-invasive species to provide pollinator habitat.
- 5) Section 8 Prior to and after construction, equipment should be cleaned to minimize probability of spreading invasive species (ie. Phragmites)
