15. Proposed Changes to the Garbage Container Limit

- D Szoller, 400 Wilkins Street – reiterating the comments as contained in the attached communication and challenging the committee to revisit this within the next couple of years for a further reduction to two think of the other layers of activity going on globally.
- Mary, Westmount – advising she doesn't believe in garbage cans because her guy just throws everything on the lawn and the road getting it everywhere, advising that due to this she puts out bags, questioning why, if the impact is so small, are we changing the limit to 3, asking if anyone has looked at townhouses and condominiums, suggesting that they just throw their garbage on the ground and have no limit and don't pay taxes, stating that she pays \$5,100.00 in taxes per year, suggesting they throw out lots of unrecyclable items including children's toys, mattresses, diving boards, indicating that not everything is recyclable including women's products, furniture, questioning that unless someone else is taking it how long does this stuff stay in a landfill.
- George Sinclair, 24 Bellview Avenue – advising he supports the reduction of containers; asking if anyone in the Municipality has given consideration to the idea of trying to intercept edible food before it goes into the dumpster behind grocery stores, stating he understands this is not the same issue, requesting that consideration be given at the local level to the idea of intercepting, redirecting edible food disposal from grocery stores and restaurants to some useful purpose.
