
14. Notice of Application to Amend the Official Plan and Zoning By-law for Near Campus Neighbourhoods







- Update released in March 2016





Context


- The 2014-2019 Poverty Reduction Strategy (PRS), Realizing Our Potential, committed the government to update the province's Long-Term Affordable Housing Strategy (ITARS) to reflect lessons learned and new research on best practices related to housing and homelessness
- The PRS also committed the government to a long-term goal of ending homelessness in Ontario and to seek expert advice, including from those with lived experience, on: defining the problem; developing new measures to collect and track data; and, defining a baseline and setting a new homelessness-related target
- In October 2015, the report of the Expert Advisory Panel on Homelessness was released and in response, Ontario committed to immediate and longer-term actions (Details are provided later in the presentation)
- On March 14, 2016, the government released the update to the Long-Term Affordable Housing Strategy

LTAHS Update: Vision and Outcomes

- The strategy is based on an **updated vision**:
- Every person has an affordable, suitable and adequate home to provide the foundation to secure employment, raise a family, and build strong communities
- This vision is associated with two overarching outcomes:
 - \circ Decreased number of people who are homeless
 - o Increased number of households achieving housing stability
- Achieving these outcomes can potentially impact a range of associated outcomes, including long-term cost avoidance in other sectors such as:
- o Decreased inappropriate use of emergency health care services
- o Decreased use of policing and correctional services
- o Increased employment
- o Increased education outcomes







Four elements of a social housing modernization framework:

1. A modern program framework replacing a patchwork of legacy programs

2. A More Coordinated Access System

3. New Approaches to Financial Assistance

4. A Vibrant Not-for-Profit and Co-operative Housing Sector
