I have previously helped organize cultural events with the Northeast Community Conversations group as well as the Ethiopian Association of London and have found that some of the most rewarding work is embedded in appreciating and valuing various cultures. Contributions: As a member of this committee I believe that I can provide an unique perspective as a youth, employee working in London and student.
