SUBJECT	MORNINGTON POND SEDIMENT REMOVAL TENDER NO. 12-19, ES2532

RECOMMENDATION

That, on the recommendation of the Executive Director, Planning, Environmental and Engineering Services & City Engineer, the following actions **BE TAKEN** with respect to the award of a contract for the construction of the Mornington Pond Sediment Removal:

- (a) The tender submitted by Ro-Buck Contracting Limited, 2326 Fanshawe Park Road E, London, ON at its price of \$224,246.00 excluding H.S.T., for the construction of the Mornington Pond Sediment Removal **BE ACCEPTED**; it being noted that Ro-Buck Contracting Limited submitted the low bid, and meets the specifications in all areas.
- (b) The financing for this project **BE APPROVED** as set out in the Sources of Financing Report <u>attached</u> hereto as Appendix "A".
- (c) The Civic Administration **BE AUTHORIZED** to undertake all the administrative acts that are necessary in connection with these projects.
- (d) The approvals given herein **BE CONDITIONAL** upon the Corporation entering into a formal contract or issuing a purchase order for the material to be supplied and the work to be done relating to these projects.


BACKGROUND


Purpose:

A tender was called seeking competitive submissions for the Mornington Pond Sediment Removal. This project restores the operational capacity of the stormwater management facility.

Background:

Mornington Pond was constructed in 1996 to serve the area generally bounded by Quebec Street to the west, Oxford Street to the north, Highbury Avenue to the east, and the rail tracks to the south. One of the conditions of the Ministry of Environment Certificate of Approval is that "The Owner shall ensure that sediment is removed from the above noted stormwater management works at such a frequency as to prevent the excessive buildup and potential overflow of sediment into the receiving watercourse." This project will fulfill that condition.





Purchasing Process

Six (6) bids were received and evaluated as a result of a tender call February 29, 2012. Ro-Buck Contracting Limited submitted the lowest bid and meets all terms, conditions, and specifications. All tender submissions have been checked by the Purchasing & Supply Division, Finance Department, and are in order.

The bid summary is attached as Appendix "B".

Funding for this project is provided in Capital Account ES2532.

There are no anticipated additional operating costs to the Planning, Environmental and Engineering Services budget in 2012 or subsequent years associated with the approval of this project.


