

## **MUSEUM LONDON**

- 95,000 square-foot Class "A" arts facility
- Employs 22 full-time employees and 15 part-time employees
- Established in 1940 on Queens Avenue (but the permanent art collection was first established in 1895)
- The current location was opened as a stand-alone art gallery in 1980
- The gallery merged with the city's heritage museums in 1989
- The art collection numbers 7,000 works and we have more than 25,000 artifacts, with a total value between 80 and 100 million dollars
