I am pleased to share with you a new publication entitled *Creating Inclusive and Equitable Cities*, prepared by the Canadian Commission for UNESCO with Dr. Meghan Brooks in collaboration with UNESCO (Secretariat of the International Coalition of Inclusive and Sustainable Cities).

- Key recommendations for municipal governments to consider and implement in their work as inclusive and equitable cities.

The variety of information in the report makes it an invaluable resource for all stakeholders involved in the development of inclusive communities, and in the implementation of city-level initiatives that contribute to advancing Agenda 2030 goals in Canada.
