RECOMMENDATION

That, on the recommendation of the Director, Community and Economic Innovation, the following Celebrate Canada 150 update report **BE RECEIVED** for information.

BACKGROUND

In 2017, Canadians from coast to coast will be celebrating the 150th anniversary of Canada’s Confederation. City Council’s 2015-2019 Strategic Plan includes a specific strategy to “Fund and partner with the community to celebrate Canada’s 150th anniversary in 2017”. This report is intended to highlight the many exciting plans underway for celebrations in London throughout 2017.

In July, 2014, Municipal Council received a 150 Anniversary of Canada Celebration funding request and resolved:

”That on the recommendation of the City Manager, the following actions be taken with respect to the London Celebrates Canada request for ongoing operational funding for the 150th Anniversary of Canada Celebration in 2017:

- a) the London Celebrates Canada Business Plan for the 150th Anniversary of Canada Celebration, attached as Appendix “A” to the staff report dated July 21, 2014 BE RECEIVED for consideration;*
- b) London Celebrates Canada, which is a not for profit incorporated organization of volunteers BE PROVIDED with ongoing operational funding for four years from 2014 to 2017, for the purpose of hiring the 150th Anniversary of Canada Coordinator, as follows, to be reduced by any federal funding that may become available:*

*2014 \$10,000
2015 \$40,000
2016 \$40,000
2017 \$40,000*

- c) the London Heritage Council BE PROVIDED with \$10,000 in ongoing operational funding for four years from 2014 to 2017 to cover administration expenses and supervision of the 150th Anniversary of Canada Coordinator.
- d) the City of London Culture Office BE DIRECTED to oversee the administration of the 150th Anniversary of Canada Celebration for the City of London; it being noted that the Office would oversee the Strategic Funding Framework Agreement with London Celebrates Canada, and the Culture Office already holds a long-term service agreement with the London Heritage Council; and
- e) the City of London Culture Office, together with its community partners London Celebrates Canada and the London Heritage Council BE REQUESTED to report back in the future with a detailed Operational Programming Plan and funding request for London's 150th Anniversary of Canada for the year 2017. (2014-F11A) (2/10/IEPC)"

This report has been prepared in response to this Council Resolution, to provide an update on the governance structure for Canada 150 and the Canada 150 London Celebration Program Plan for the year 2017.

GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE FOR CANADA 150 LONDON

The governance structure for Canada 150 London, attached as Appendix "A" to this report, was established in the fall of 2014 in response to the above noted Council Resolution. The Canada 150 Steering Committee was created and is composed of the lead partners of the London Heritage Council, London Celebrates Canada and the City of London Culture Office.

The Canada 150 London Coordinator, Lia Karidas, was hired by the London Heritage Council in April 2015 to support the Canada 150 Steering Committee. The Job Description of the Canada 150 London Coordinator is attached as Appendix "B" to this report for information.

The Coordinator works closely with the Canada 150 London Programming Committee, which represents many sectors of the London community. The purpose of the Programming Committee, described in the Terms of Reference attached as Appendix "C" to this report, is to engage the community throughout 2017 through educational programs, activities, events, exhibitions and premier Canada Day celebrations to install pride and commitment to Canada on both an individual and community level. The Programming Committee is responsible for developing the Canada 150 London Celebration Program Plan described in the next section of this report.

THE CANADA 150 LONDON CELEBRATION PROGRAM PLAN

Many exciting plans are already underway for celebrations in London, as outlined in this Canada 150 London Celebration Program Plan of this report. This Program Plan is a diverse collection of events, initiatives, campaigns, and legacy projects designed to harness a spirit of nationalism and celebration amongst all Londoners.

1. Canada 150 London Signature Events

Signature Events/Initiatives refer to high-impact, maximum participation projects to create positive experiences throughout the year. These will be designed and promoted as events epitomizing the Canada 150 London brand. For example, some of these being initiated will include: New Year's Eve 2016 & 2017 (December 2016 and 2017), Earth Day 150 (April 2017) an event at Western University (May 2017) and Canada Day (July 1, 2017).

2. Community Initiatives for Canada's 150th

The Coordinator acts as a shared resource for the greater London community, and encourages participation from all Londoners in the sesquicentennial year. Many programmers have designed their own initiatives and events for the sesquicentennial year, and with the blessing of Canada 150 London, will have access to: versions of the logo for use on promotional material, as well as alternate channels for marketing via the Canada 150 London social media accounts and web hub. In some instances, Community Initiatives include 150-themed programming and content augmenting regular or recurring festivals and events (e.g. many summer festivals are employing this strategy). The current Program List of community initiatives for Canada 150 London is attached as Appendix "D" to this report.

3. Granting Program Support

The Coordinator regularly navigates interested 150 event programmers through the various granting programs offered at all levels of government. Because the London plan for Canada 150 is so complex and robust, it is the privilege of the Coordinator to know the details of the year-long plan and advise programmers as to how their initiative fits within the overall narrative. This has included fund-leveraging strategizing, brokering partnerships, and contributing support letters as appropriate.

The Community Fund for Canada's 150th, a program offered jointly by Community Foundations Canada and London Community Foundation has recently closed submissions. The interested applicants were encouraged during the submission process to contact the Canada 150 London Coordinator for immediate feedback on their idea. The Coordinator was at the deliberation table contributing factual support for all projects that have been submitted.

Other programs that the Coordinator has contributed support for have included: The Canada 150 Fund, Ontario 150 (Celebration Program), FedDev Community Infrastructure Improvement Fund (for which 10 London programs were successfully funded in the first round), the Celebrate Canada Program, TD Friends of the Environment, and the Celebrate Ontario.

The City of London has applied to many of these federal and provincial granting programs and to date funding has been received for the following projects:

- Improvement of the Main Trail at Westminster Ponds FedDev Ontario Contribution - \$98,901;
- Renovation of the Pavilion in Harris Park FedDev Ontario Contribution - \$495,000; and
- Repair of the Victoria Park Cenotaph FedDev Ontario Contribution - \$158,242.

4. Canada 150 Marketing & Merchandise

The official web hub of Canada 150 London located at www.londoncelebrates.ca and www.canada150london.ca is a one-stop virtual source of information about Canada's 150th Anniversary in London. Featuring editorial content, photo galleries, links to event information and an attractive design, the site is the landing page for anyone who wants to know what is happening in London for 2017. A comprehensive version of the 2017 calendar is being soft launched over the next two months, with a formal media launch to take place in early 2017.

Canada 150 merchandise (both national and regional in distribution) will decorate London and region throughout the big year. The Coordinator is working in collaboration with Cotton Candy, the promotional product company that won the bid for the federal government's Canada 150

merchandise. As a result of their selection, they are also an official “one-stop-shop” for logo use and co-branding possibilities. Co-branded Canada 150 products for London are being pursued by multiple organizations within the city for their own 150 events.

Partnerships with local clothing companies have also been explored, and the option of London-specific 150 commemorative merchandise is on the horizon and will be made available for public purchase at the beginning of 2017.

5. Regional, Provincial and National Engagement

London was one of the first communities to emerge with a brand presence for 2017, and as one of the only communities in Canada with a dedicated Coordinator, has followed suit with the nation’s capital cities, offering dedicated 150 programming throughout the entire year. The Coordinator has been proactive about creating relationships with 150 programmers across the nation, including ongoing discussions with Ottawa 2017, Montreal 375, 150 Alliance, Canada 150 (federal brand), Ontario 150, and others.

It is through these partnerships that many of London’s local signature events have come to fruition, ensuring that the national scope of the sesquicentennial is experienced at the local level. For example: in partnership with Ottawa 2017, Canada 150 London plans to curate a London-focused exhibit at Inspiration Village, an expo-style temporary structure in Byward Market. The exhibit will receive national coverage and connect London to the greater Canadian narrative.

In addition to these specific collaborations, three representatives from London, Ontario: an elected official, a staff member, and a citizen will be delegated as Canada 150 Community Leaders on the FCM 150 Network, a communication stream for sesquicentennial activity amongst municipalities. London looks forward to showcasing the great work taking place locally in commemoration of Canada’s 150th, and plans to continue being a leader in this milestone initiative.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

1. The 150th Canada Day- July 1st

London is in a unique position wherein the city truly comes to life on Canada Day every single year. With 10 local Canada Day celebrations, and counting, Londoners have a bounty of options to select from when it comes to celebrating the day. The Coordinator has been in communication with all of the celebrations, and has made it a priority item to maximize the potential of each of these events for the 150th Canada Day. An example of the 2016 Canada Day Grid is attached as Appendix “E” to this report.

Strategies for this include curated programming, for which there is currently an outstanding grant to Ontario 150, an aggressive joint marketing campaign (following a well-utilized Canada Day Guide that was created by the coordinator for the 2016 celebrations), and opportunities to harness social and digital media for the purpose of connecting Londoners across sites.

The celebration at Harris Park, organized by the Canada 150 London Lead Partner “London Celebrates Canada”, marks the Downtown initiative of the 150th Canada Day.

2. May Event at Western University

London will play temporary home to a major traveling exhibit that will capture the imaginations of citizens and tourists for one week in May 2017. This historic event, backed by Canada 150, Ontario 150, CBC, and presented through a partnership between the City of London, Western University, London Heritage Council and Canada 150 London will be one of the most incredible showpieces of the 2017 year.

3. Truth & Reconciliation

The theme of Truth & Reconciliation with First Nations is pervasive throughout the Canada 150 commemoration in London, and all proposed signature level projects will employ this theme, including the activities on the 150th Canada Day. Smaller-scale community initiatives have also taken this theme to heart, and engagement with the Indigenous community is a recurring and important theme of this milestone year in London. A large number of events submitted for funding consideration to the London Community Foundation fund for Canada's 150th have involved Indigenous themes and collaboration.

4. Children & Youth

Sesquicentennial programming for children and youth is fundamental to ensuring that the legacy of Canada 150 London remains vibrant for the next 50 years. School groups and youth organizations will be heavily engaged during the May Event at Western University, by way of targeted programming, and environmental and cultural theme explorations that correlate with elementary school curriculum. Youth-oriented Canada 150 programs will emerge throughout the 2017 year in the Community Initiative category, including musical theatre programs and music competitions, nature and species preservation initiatives, and youth programming at museums.

5. Wards & Neighbourhood Involvement

Because of the dual focus of the Canada 150 London program plan (i.e. both Signature Events and Community Events), the geographic distribution of events is varied, with multiple wards already experiencing, or planned to be experiencing 150 programming within their neighbourhoods. More of these events are being communicated to the Coordinator each day, and there is still room to encourage additional 150 animation in all parts of the city. If Councilors are interested in encouraging additional animation within their ward, please contact the Canada 150 London Coordinator to discuss what might be possible.

The Coordinator has presented to Area Services, East, West & Friends, Downtown London Rotary Club, South London Rotary Club, North London Rotary Club, arts and heritage organizations, and museum managers, ensuring that the mechanism to contribute 150 programming to the overall plan is available to all wards and neighbourhoods. Additionally, all Londoners are welcome to respond to the Canada 150 London "Call for Volunteers" which will put them on the list of individuals who will be invited to volunteer at any number of 150 events throughout 2017.

CONCLUSION

Canada’s 150 anniversary is an important historic milestone, and London is well positioned to contribute to its celebration. 2017 will be an exciting year of events commemorations, celebrations, dedications, legacies, and experiences that will underline the incredible pride we all share for our homeland.

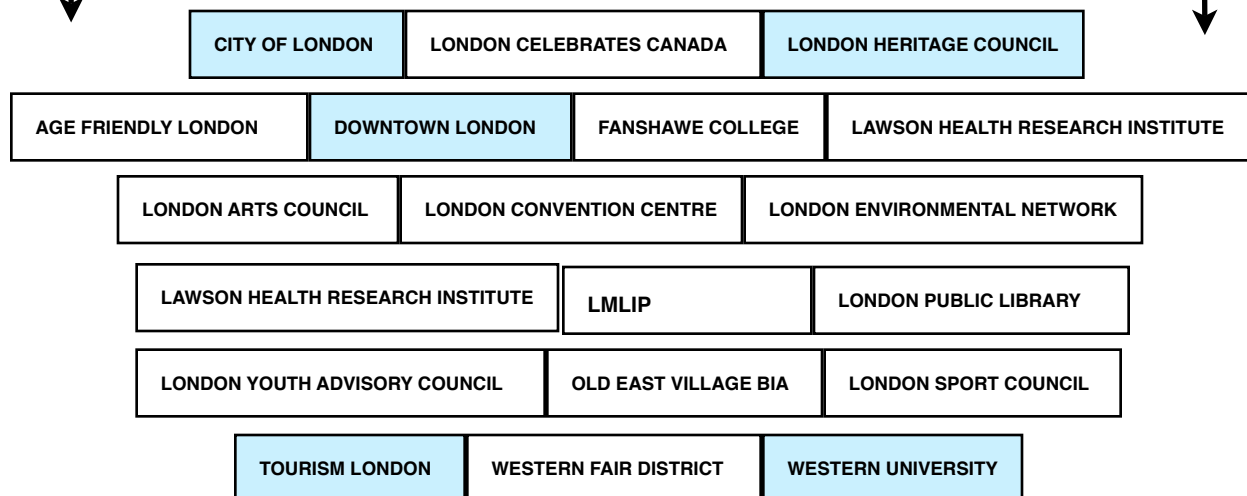

Job purpose

Act as the lead in planning, fund developing, marketing and executing, events, celebrations, commemorations and programming, leading up to and including 2017, for London, ON, with guidance from the 150th Anniversary of Canada Programming Committee. The Coordinator will take advantage of leveraging opportunities with community groups and organizations to benefit London. The community expects to find 150th Anniversary of Canada Programming, well organized, inclusive and memorable.

The Coordinator will be located in the London Heritage Council office and will report directly to the London Heritage Council (LHC) Executive Director. The LHC is contracted by the City of London, through the Culture Office, over the term of Council to deliver and administer heritage programs and services and implementation of London's Cultural Prosperity Plan.

This is a contract position, terminating December 31st, 2017.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

- Work with Programming Committee partners to design and plan, and implement events and programming leading up to, and for 2017, which will be agreed upon to form the 150th Anniversary Program Plan of the Programming Committee
- Identify funding sources, write and edit funding applications and proposals for events
- Identify, pursue and manage prospective community partnerships in relation to events
- Assist with tourism marketing and promotion efforts
- Provide creative input given to website concept, draft website content
- Write and edit all content for event deliverables
- Create and file event funding reports
- Steward event sponsors, partners and funders throughout the course of the project
- Give public presentations related to events, and programming
- Facilitate meetings, prepare agendas, take and distribute minutes as required
- Manage, train and coordinate event and programming volunteers
- Serve as the primary contact person for event and programming related inquiries

- Attend event and staff related meetings as required
- Attend designated committee meetings

Knowledge and Skills

Canada's 150th Celebration Coordinator, London will have the following qualifications;

- Demonstrated experience in event planning and volunteer management
- Knowledge and understanding of marketing and promotion
- Proven grant writing and fundraising abilities
- General awareness London community
- Experience with non-profit sector and business sector in London
- Responsible, meticulous, able to work autonomously and under tight deadlines
- Strong interpersonal communication skills for effective relationship building
- Demonstrated team player attitude
- A versatile, highly organized and stringent eye for detail
- Out of the box thinking
- Proficiency in a fully computerized environment and especially MS Office (Word, Excel, Outlook, Power Point, Access)
- Strong communication, writing, reading and oral skills in English

Working conditions

- Contract, termination date December 31st 2017
- 40 hours weekly, generally Monday to Friday.
- Flexible hours, some evening and weekend work may be required. Lieu time will be given for extra time worked.
- Vehicle is required.
- Some travel may be required; and will be compensated.

PURPOSE
