1. Review, updates of Active items

- a) Community Gardens:
 - Presentation by Scott Stafford (see attachment)
 - Site Plan review of both Ed Blake Park and Kiwanis Park (proposed for spring 2017)
 Our suggestions included:
 - Water tap height, valve style, reachable by hard surface
 - Raised planters variable heights and profiles, structural stability
 - Raised planters access dimensions (reach-ability) and turning radius
 - Increased pathway width between and amongst std. plots (from 1.0 and 1.2m to 1.5m) for increased "visit-ability"
 - Discussion and review of the City of Vancouver's, 2011 design guidelines for accessible community gardens (see attachment)
 Re: was recognized as a positive resource as it includes both dimensions and rationale for good design practices
 - Discussion of how best we (ACCAC) can work together with the City to improve access to community gardens going forward Suggestions included:
 - Review of site plans for both newly constructed and renovated gardens
 - Our assistance in the development of a general design guide
 - Note: there is currently a proposal by the City to designate a full-time staff position and/or department directly responsible for the management of Community Gardens


- b) FADS document review:

Guidelines: How to start a community garden?

- Community gardens are neighbourhood initiated
- Must identify a possible site
- Need support from a minimum of 10 gardeners
- Site will be reviewed by City to meet certain criteria
- If accepted, the City will send a letter to all homes within 250 m of the proposed location
- If there is demonstrated support, a site plan will be prepared by the City that will comply with AODA and FADS
- Gardeners will work with the City to construct their garden beds raised beds and other accessibility attributes are supported

From FADS (2007)

Community gardens should:

- Have 10% of plots, or a minimum of one accessible planting bed
- Shall be raised 460mm (18") above the ground surface
- · Located on an accessible route (preferred minimum width of 1830mm (72")
