

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE Queens Avenue and Colborne Street Cycletracks

The implementation of cycletracks on Queens Avenue and Colborne Street in Downtown London is a premier feature of the new cycling master plan that was approved by Council in September 2016. The cycletracks will provide improved active transportation connectivity into and across the downtown. A preliminary design has been developed for these corridors and City Council endorsed the implementation of cycletracks on Queens Avenue from Ridout Street to Colborne Street, and on Colborne Street from Dufferin Avenue to Horton Street at its meeting on January 17, 2017. The project is now in a design phase with the goal of constructing the project in 2017.



### Project History:

At this stage, the project team has completed the following tasks:

1. Reviewed the Cycling Master Plan and considered various design alternatives for the two corridors;
2. Evaluated each alternative and selected a two-way cycletrack on the north side of Queens Avenue and one-way cycletracks on both sides of Colborne Street as the preferred designs;
3. Developed a preliminary design for both corridors

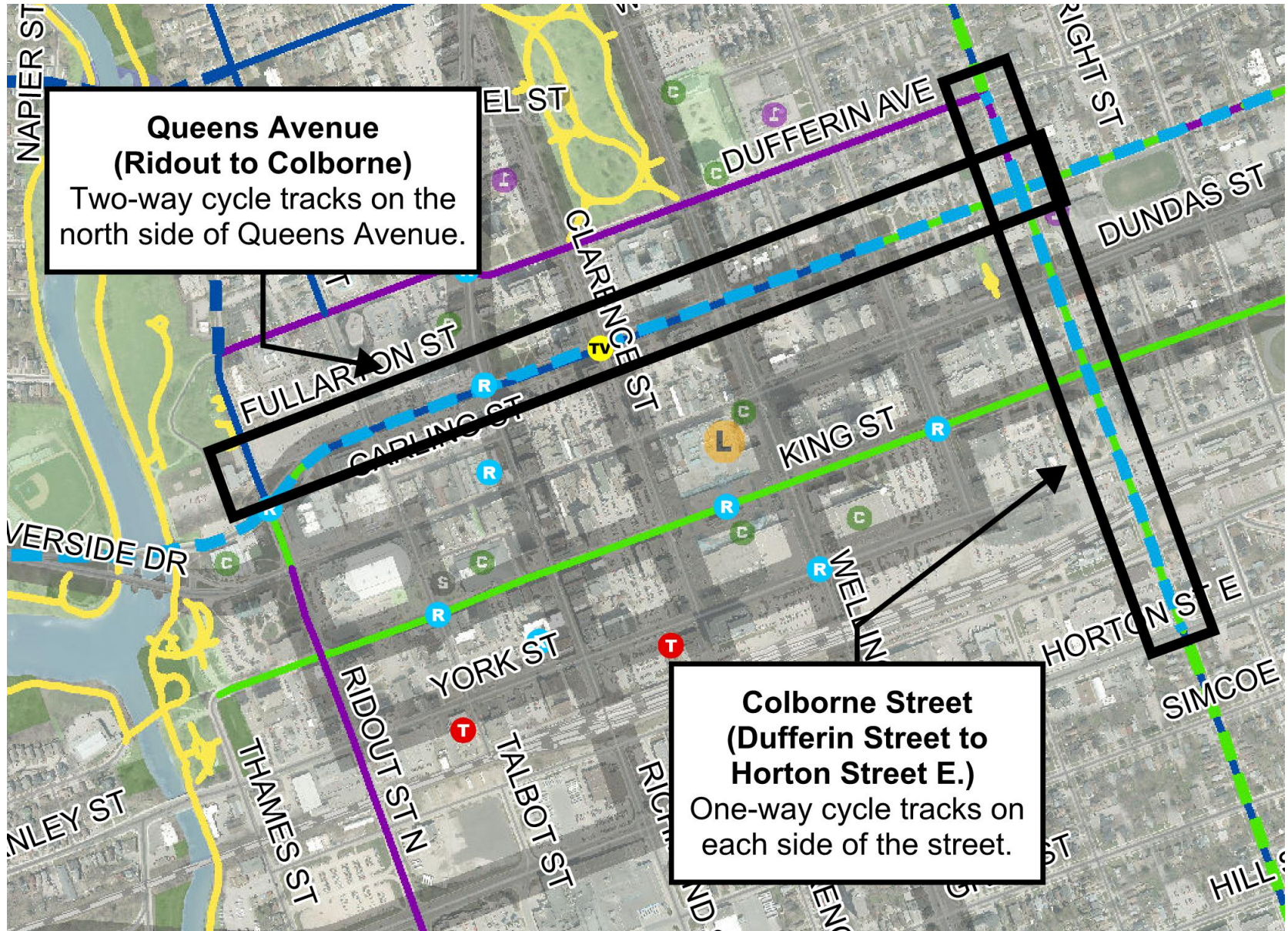
