




MIXED ACTIVITY PARK:



PARK ACCESSIBILITY


We are inviting comments and suggestions regarding the accessible design features of this project, as required by the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA), 2005.

ACCESSIBLE ON-STREET PARKING

• There are 6 accessible parking spaces included with the new parking lot of the Community Centre. Is there a need for additional on-street parking spaces off of Churchill Avenue?

RECREATIONAL TRAILS

- All proposed pathways consist of concrete or asphalt with a minimum width of 2 metres and a maximum slope of 4%, as per City of London Facility Accessibility Design Standards (FADS).
- A grasspave area is proposed to improve accessibility to the soccer field for spectators with mobility challenges. Is this a desirable feature?



OUTDOOR PLAY SPACES

• A new playground is proposed. What are the needs of children and caregivers with various disabilities?

EXTERIOR PATH OF TRAVEL: REST AREAS

- Average distance between rest areas are approximately 100 metres.
- Is the design and placement of seating areas along proposed pathways sufficient?
