WHEREAS,

- Ayerswood Development Corp. is again attempting to circumvent a 2001Ontario Municipal Board (OMB) ruling and to increase the size of the development it proposes for a forested site on Reservoir Hill.
- Ayerswood proposed a 12- storey building in 2004, and again in 2009, which had a footprint that was approximately 50% larger than the one the OMB approved in 2001. Each proposed site plan was rejected by London City Council and, subsequently, by the OMB.
- Now, in 2011, Ayerswood is proposing a development of essentially the same size as it did in 2004 and 2009. City Council recently voted to approve the development, even though it had not received and reviewed all the engineering and environmental impact reports required to complete Ayerswood's site plan application.

We, the undersigned concerned Londoners and friends of Reservoir Hill, petition our councillors to defend the process, represent constituents and uphold the OMB-mandated restrictions on development of this property.

We urge our councillors to minimize the environmental impact of any development that cuts into the steep slope of Reservoir Hill and to protect the hill in accordance with the OMB's repeated direction to Ayerswood.
