London has a history of dividing itself when we need to make major decisions. I remember clearly the hue and cry over supporting the expansion of Fanshawe College downtown and how many said it would ruin Londons downtown but this was never, and is not currently, the case. Now we have BRT and while those who oppose BRT say they support it their signs uncover the truth of their beliefs." Stop London City Council From throwing us under the bus". So they do no support BRT. Why? Because it inconveniences them and because they down want to spend money today for a return on investment tomorrow. Let me say that if Council does not approve a vigorous and forward thinking BRT plan then we are doomed with the legacy that now haunts us over the ring road. Council needs to be leaders now and not water down the proposal with worries of their political future. We need to actually do something that creates opportunities for our collective future and not be fooled by the siren call of the immediate. The tunnel and the proposed routes are the best case, evidence based approach to BRT in London. Do whats right and build a future, not pander to the political present. I'm a Londoner and I support moving forward with a strong rapid transit system.
