Established 1995

Façade Improvement Loan Program

For property owners who improve exterior building facades. (Including: windows, awnings, decorative lighting, eaves troughs and fascia, etc. on the front of the building.)

NEW - CIP Project (Richmond Row) Area

Starting
January 1, 2018

Loans up to \$50,000 or half of the value of the work (whichever is less)

Loans are paid back at 0% interest over a 10 year period

Upgrade to Building Code Loan Program

For property owners who are improving buildings to comply with current Building Code Requirements. (Including: fire protection/separation, HVAC, roofs, stairs and elevators etc.)

NEW - CIP Project (Richmond Row) Area

Starting
January 1, 2018

Loans up to \$200,000 or half of the value of the work (whichever is less)

Loans are paid back at 0% interest over a 10 year period

Next Steps

- Fall 2017 Report to PEC on expanded Project Area:
- Prepare Downtown Program Guidelines for changes to be implemented on January 1, 2018
- Ongoing monitoring reports of program activity
- Council consider programs changes at future budget deliberations
