# NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO AMEND THE ZONING BY-LAW

The Municipal Council for the City of London is considering an amendment to the City's Zoning By-law for the lands shown on the attached map. The requested change is described below. We are advising you of this application to invite your comments.

# **APPLICANT:**

Farhi Holdings

#### LOCATION:

200 Albert Street, 192 – 196 Central Avenue and 193 – 197 Central Avenue - see attached map

## **PURPOSE AND EFFECT:**

The purpose and effect of the requested Zoning By-law amendment is to permit the continued operation of the existing surface commercial parking lot uses located on the three subject properties for an additional three (3) years.

## POSSIBLE AMENDMENT:

Change Zoning By-law Z.-1 **BY AMENDING** the temporary use provisions of the existing Residential R10/Office Conversion/Temporary (R10-3·H24/OC7/T-70) Zone at 200 Albert Street, the existing Holding Residential R3/Residential R4/Residential R8/Office Conversion/Restricted Office/Temporary (h-5·R3-1/R4-1/R8-4/OC7/RO3/T-70) Zone at 193 – 197 Central Avenue, and the existing Residential R10/Office Residential/Temporary (R10-4·H-26/OR5·D303·H26/T-70) Zone at 192 – 196 Central Avenue **TO EXTEND** the temporary commercial parking lots for an additional three (3) years.

## **PLANNING POLICIES:**

Any change to the Zoning By-law must conform to the policies of the Official Plan, London's long-range planning document. These lands are currently designated as Multi-family, High Density Residential in the Official Plan, which permits a broad range of low and high-rise apartment buildings, apartment hotels, multiple-attached dwellings, emergency care facilities, nursing homes, rest homes, homes for the aged, and rooming and boarding houses as the main permitted uses.

200 Albert Street in is the Rapid Transit Corridor Place Type in *The London Plan* (Counciladopted but not fully in force and effect), permitting a range of residential, retail, service, office, cultural, recreation and institutional uses. 192 – 196 Central Avenue and 193 – 197 Central Avenue are in the Neighbourhoods Place Type in *The London Plan*, permitting a range of residential uses from single detached dwellings to fourplexes, stacked townhouses and lowrise apartments, home occupations, group homes, and small-scale community facilities.

## **PUBLIC MEETING:**

The appropriateness of the requested Zoning By-law amendment will be considered at a future meeting of the Planning & Environment Committee. You will receive another notice inviting you to attend this meeting.

If a person or public body does not make oral or written submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the City of London before the proposed amendment is adopted, the person or public body may not be entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the City of London to the Ontario Municipal Board, or may not be added by the Board as a party to the hearing of an appeal unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.
