RE: Monthly Report for July 2017
Attached are the Building Division's monthly report for July 2017 and copies of the Summary of the Inspectors' Workload reports.

## Permit Issuance

By the end of July, 2,939 permits had been issued with a construction value of approximately $\$ 659$ million, representing 1,667 new dwelling units. Compared to last year, this represents a $4.2 \%$ increase in the number of permits, a $14.1 \%$ decrease in the construction value and an $6 \%$ decrease in the number of dwelling units.

To the end of July, the number of single and semi-detached dwellings issued were 646, which was a $24.9 \%$ increase over last year.

At the end of July, there were 729 applications in process, representing approximately \$302 million in construction value and an additional 795 dwelling units, compared with 531 applications having a construction value of $\$ 266$ million and an additional 461 dwelling units for the same period last year.

The rate of incoming applications for the month of July averaged out to 24 applications a day for a total of 480 in 20 working days. There were 70 permit applications to build 70 new single detached dwellings, 18 townhouse applications to build 32 units, of which 14 were cluster single dwelling units.

There were 512 permits issued in July totalling $\$ 128.5$ million including 319 new dwelling units.

## Inspections

## BUILDING

Building Inspectors received 3,070 inspection requests and conducted 3,376 building related inspections. No inspections were completed relating to complaints, business licenses, orders and miscellaneous inspections. Based on a staff compliment of 12 inspectors, an average of 338 inspections were conducted this month per inspector.

Based on the 3,070 requested inspections for the month, $79 \%$ were achieved within the provincially mandated 48 hour time allowance.

## PLUMBING

Plumbing Inspectors received 1,266 inspection requests and conducted 1,376 plumbing related inspections. No inspections were completed relating to complaints, business licenses, orders and miscellaneous inspections. Based on a staff compliment of 5.5 inspectors, an average of 275 inspections were conducted this month per inspector.

Based on the 1,266 requested inspections for the month, $97 \%$ were achieved within the provincially mandated 48 hour time allowance.

## NOTE:

In some cases, several inspections will be conducted on a project where one call for a specific individual inspection has been made. One call could result in multiple inspections being conducted and reported. Also, in other instances, inspections were prematurely booked, artificially increasing the number of deferred inspections.
