The City of London is undertaking a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to determine rehabilitation or replacement alternatives for Victoria Bridge over the Thames River on Ridout Street. The study will determine the best solution to address the general structural deterioration of the bridge and bridge widening options to accommodate all users including pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles.
