Idea: Small Business Grants

Description Montreal has a small business grant of up to \$30,000 available for young people between 18-35. I lived there for six years and knew so many people who had received this grant to get their small businesses up and running. For awhile I worked for a company that had it's start this way, a company that does public ceramic and marble mosaic projects locally and internationally, and for private commissions as well.

As a result, we have employed people, as well as a more interesting, diverse, and enjoyable city.
