I have a Master's of Arts degree in Planning from the University of Waterloo, as well as a Bachelor's of Environmental Studies (Environment and Resource Studies major, minor in Sustainable Local Economic Development). I have a post-graduate certificate from Niagara College in Ecosystem Restoration, and am also a certified seed collector and trained in ecological land classification.

From 2011 - 2015, I worked as the Parks & Aftercare Project Manager for ReForest London. During this time, I led 112 naturalization projects within the city and supervised an additional 39 schoolyard planting projects and other tree-related initiatives, coordinating the planting and distribution of over 30,000 trees and shrubs. I was also responsible for supervising our aftercare program, and supporting the development of London's Million Tree Challenge.

I currently work as ReForest London's Director of Programs, and am responsible for supervising our programs and helping to set strategic direction for the organization.
