I was a member-at-large on the Environmental and Ecological Planning Advisory Committee (EEPAC) from January- April 2019. During this time, I provided comments on an Environmental Impact Assessment at 348 Sunningdale Road.

What do you hope to contribute or learn as part of an Advisory Committee? (maximum 750 characters, attach an extra sheet if you need more space)

I hope to contribute to EEPAC my experience studying geochemistry and lake ecosystem health. As a third-year PhD candidate at the University of Western Ontario, I have an intimate understanding of how lakes in southern Ontario respond to perturbations such as nutrient-rich runoff from agricultural fields and erosion associated with development. I also worked for one summer with the Friends of the Coves Subwatershed Inc., so have an in-depth knowledge of the Coves Subwatershed. From EEPAC, I hope to learn how to mitigate the effects of development on terrestrial ecosystems, which I am less familiar with. I am most interested in learning about how the City of London balances the needs of developers with environmental protection.

I will support the work of EEPAC by contributing to discussion in areas of my expertise, and also by continuing to review documents such as Environmental Impact Assessments. As I learn more about the impact of development on terrestrial ecosystems I will make contributions in areas outside of my expertise.

As mentioned above, I am trained as an aquatic geochemist. I also volunteered and then worked for ~1.5 years in a wetland lab at the Biotron Institute for Experimental Climate Change Research, so I can contribute some knowledge about threats to wetland health. Regarding community involvement, I have volunteered primarily with ReForest London, and have led several on-campus sustainability initiatives. For one summer I worked with Friends of the Coves Subwatershed Inc. During that summer, I helped to write two successful grants for the organization, which required me to consult frequently with the Environmental & Parks Planning Division of the City of London.
