




Service Business Plan and Budget Cycle


•report on current subsidies and potential re-allocation of resources, related to heritage, arts and culture





Special Events


 report on opportunities to reevaluate rental fees for "for-profit" events, with a charity component, based on the amount of eventprofit being provided to the charity


Sports Services

- investigate opportunities related to the maintenance of subdivision developments (boulevards, stormwater management ponds, etc.), including retro-active opportunities












Fleet Services








Corporate Management

• Business Plan for the implementation of a 311 System; it being noted that improved customer service and internal efficiencies are a priority for the Service Review Committee








Financial Management
