Size of Tree Protected

- OProtecting only "large" trees:
 - OReduces # of species protected
 - OMeans "the next generation" of forest is not necessarily protected
 - OImportant that concern for these trees does not get lost in drive to save iconic trees
 - O Any strategy to protect urban forest must protect trees of ALL ages
 - OBest available tools to do so?
 - O Also: Consideration for, education around "snags"

Size of Tree Protected

O However:

- O# of trees protected by bylaw increases exponentially as size limit decreases
- OStaff estimate going from 50 cm -> 20-25 cm would equate to a four-fold increase in workload
 - OAn incremental increase may be preferable (40 cm?)
 - Olncreases must be met with additional resources so staff are not pulled from other important work solely to enforce by-law

Justification for Cutting

- O Define: what constitutes a hazardous tree
- Photos should be provided as a part of the permit application
- Provide checklist of what constitutes "best practice" as part of justifying removal



Golf Courses & Cemeteries

- Question of exemption
 - OUnfair competition argument
 - OTrees are a valued asset argument
- Rather than providing an exemption, the City should hold itself to the same standard as private landowners
