Social Housing

Public Housing



- Managed by the London Middlesex Housing Corporation
- Developments that were downloaded to the City by the province in 2000
- 3300 rent-geared-to-income units

Yes – some of the large developments have had ongoing social problems

The answer – community development

Budget Proposition: \$481,000 Reduction

- Reduced unit painting
- Reduced grass cutting (every 2 weeks)
- Reduced garbage collection
- Elimination of summer recreation program

Affordable Housing







- New units, offered at 70% or 80% of market rent
- Always in partnership with private sector
- \$ leveraged at 7:1
- \$4.5M of planned outdraws from \$4M reserve
- Target is 1000 units from 2010-2015, current fiscal plan has us at 614 units

Toolbox Approach

- Renovation
- New home ownership
- Rent supplement
- New units
- Convert-to-rent

Budget Proposition: Annual \$1,000,000 Reduction

- Inability to meet target
- Loss of leveraged funds
- Move to more temporary units
- Delay for 3,005 family units on housing wait list
- Inability to move people from shelter to home
