



MESSAGE FROM LONDON'S MAYOR


Dear Friends:



FACILITY

OVERVIEW

The John Labatt Centre is the premiere entertainment and sports facility for London and Southwestern Ontario. The facility, considered one of the key catalysts in the redevelopment of London's downtown core, hosts numerous shows each year spanning all genres from rock to country, hockey to family shows. The facility seats 9,090 for hockey and ice events and up to 10,500 for concerts, family shows and other events. The facility has 1,100 premium club seats, 38 private luxury suites and five Group Sales Suites.


The John Labatt Centre incorporates modern and traditional architecture, combining a replica of the façade of the old Talbot Inn, a 19th century inn which stood on the spot of the current facility, along with state-of-the-art architecture for the best of both worlds.

In addition to having the ability to accommodate both End and Centre-Stage concerts and shows, the facility was also designed with the arts patron in mind, thanks to the 3,199-guest RBC Theatre, which was designed to accommodate touring Broadway shows and smaller concerts. The RBC Theatre is also complete with a 30-line fly grid which allows for ease in movement for stage productions, setting the theatre apart from other venues.



BEE CLEAN

Janitorial Services throughout the John Labatt Centre are provided by Bee Clean Janitorial Services. Bee Clean provides four major components which comprise the cleaning requirements for the facility. Non-Event Cleaning is comprised of two full-time weekday cleaners who address the day-to-day and preparatory cleaning requirements of the venue.


Event Cleaning involves an event cleaning crew which, number dependent on the size, type and demographic of the event, addresses all ongoing cleaning requirements during an event to ensure a clean and safe event environment.

Post-Event Cleaning involves a crew which, number dependent on the size, type and demographic of the event, cleans the venue in its entirety upon the completion of an event.

The final component is Periodic Cleaning which, number dependent on tasks at hand, will clean specific item(s) in need of attention due to ongoing use and/or as a result of an event (i.e. cup holders in premium seating; bowl seats after a dirt event).

ISM SECURITY

Innovative Security Management (1998)
Inc. provides licensed uniformed contracted security for the venue and its events.
Security needs will vary depending on the nature of the event and may include a presence in the following positions; barricade, wings, dressing rooms/back of house, parking lot, moat, mix, roamer, gates for pat down, smoking areas, and/or other static positions in the venue.

From dining in The Talbot Bar & Grille to booking a private function in The Talbot Lounge or Club Cambria, Ovations offers you the opportunity to dine where the action is.

JOHNSON CONTROLS

Johnson Controls Incorporated provides an extensive Service Plan Agreement which is currently in the seventh year of a 25-year term. The agreement is founded on an extensive and comprehensive service plan which provides a full-time operator to the John Labatt Centre.


Johnson Controls Incorporated is charged with many tasks crucial to the day-to-day building operations, including a comprehensive operation and maintenance program for all Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) equipment.

I.A.T.S.E Local 105

I.A.T.S.E. Local 105 provides skilled labour necessary to undertake those functions associated with the arrival, performance and departure of concerts, speaking engagements and/or theatrical performances.

Such skilled labour includes the movement and set up of lighting and sound equipment, set up of props, sets, wardrobe, and rigging of all show-related material/equipment. Labour force requirements are governed by the size and/or specifications associated with the event.

The cost of this service is dependent on the staffing requirements for each event and the number of hours employed. Global Spectrum Facility Management is extremely pleased with the relationship, effort and quality of work provided by I.A.T.S.E.

MARKET SEGMENT RESULTS

The John Labatt Centre hosted a total of 141 events in the 2011-2012 fiscal year. Events not represented in the total number of events include ice rentals, charitable, community and press events.

Performing Arts shows comprised 12% of the results with 17 performances.

20 Family shows were held at the venue during the fiscal year or 14%. Family shows usually occupy the facility for multiple days with anywhere from 1-8 shows during that time period. Multiple performances on the same day are considered separate events.

The London Knights appeared in 47 home games accounting for 33% of events.

The London Lightning appeared in 22 home games accounting for 16% of events.


There were 5 Miscellaneous Sporting events that accounted for 3.5% of events reported in the last fiscal year. This includes the NHL Preseason game, Professional Bull Riders and Synchro in the City.


25 concerts were held at the venue accounting for 18% of all events.

Other events accounting for 3.5% of the total events at the John Labatt Centre included the Thames Valley District School Board "Variety Is" concert and Video Games Live.


NHL PRESEASON GAME:

PHILADELPHIA FLYERS v. DETROIT RED WINGS September 22, 2012

The Philadelphia Flyers returned to their home away from home in London to face the Detroit Red Wings in a highly anticipated match-up. This was the first time these two teams had met in preseason action and the game certainly lived up to the hype with a shootout needed to determine the victor. Former Philadelphia Flyer, Detroit Red Wing and London Knight draftee, Mark Howe, was on hand to take the ceremonial face off before a loud and boisterous crowd. Howe, who was inducted into the NHL Hall of Fame in November of 2011 was given a very warm reception for the appreciative London crowd.

The game, presented once again by Scotiabank, was the culmination of a great day that included the Canadian Tire Block Party which featured an outdoor beer garden with great live entertainment and numerous interactive displays. This year the official charity of the game was the Canadian Tire Jump Start program who benefited from a number of fundraising initiatives.





TENANT SUCCESS


2011-2012 was a banner year for our tenant teams at the John Labatt Centre. The London Knights claimed the Robertson Cup title as OHL Champions for the first time since 2005 and the second time in team history. The Knights disposed of their arch rival Windsor Spitfires with a sweep in the first round before being taken to six games in the second round by Saginaw. The third round matched the Knights up against an old nemesis in the Kitchener Rangers but the Knights were able to prevail in four hard fought games. The OHL Championship series was a battle between the top ranked team from the West and the number one team from the East, the Niagara Ice Dogs. This highly anticipated series lasted only five games with the Knights taking the title on home ice before a packed John Labatt Centre. The 2012 MasterCard Memorial Cup was played in Shawinagan, Quebec and the Knights exceeded expectations by coming out of the round robin with the best record and earning a bye into the final game. Alas, backed by their hometown crowd, Shawinigan scored with just over two minutes left in overtime to take the title.

In addition to being a very successful season for the team, there were a few individual standouts as well. Goaltender, Michael Houser, was named The CHL goaltender of the year, OHL goaltender of the year and was awarded the Red Tilson trophy given annually to the OHL's Most Outstanding Player. Centre, Austin Watson received the Wayne Gretzky #99 trophy after being named the MVP of the OHL Championship Series. At the 2012 NHL Entry Draft held in June, the London Knights had six players drafted which was more than any Junior team worldwide.

In their first year of play, the London Lightning took the NBL by storm finishing first in the league in regular season play as well as attendance. The Lightning started the playoffs on the road in a best of three series against the Saint John's Mill Rats. After sweeping the series, only the Halifax Rainmen stood between them and the championship trophy. The best of five series began with London winning the first two games at the John Labatt Centre only to have Halifax win the next two setting up a decisive game five in London. Before 5,000 plus fans dressed in the team colours of black and yellow, the Lightning took control of the game in the fourth quarter and closed out their championship run 116-92, taking their place in history as the inaugural NBL champions.

Individual accolades were also given to Forward, Gabe Freeman, who was named regular season and playoff MVP and Head Coach Michael Ray Richardson was voted Coach of the Year. Global Spectrum Facility Management are proud of the accomplishments of both teams and would like to congratulate the London Knights and London Lightning franchises on two spectacular seasons. We look forward to raising two championship banners in the fall and many more in the years to come.






TOMMY HUNTER: THE FINAL SHOW

It was a bittersweet goodbye on March 20th at the John Labatt Centre as Canada's country gentleman and local icon, Tommy Hunter, brought his guitar to rest against his stool for a final time, bringing a close to his concert touring days after six decades of entertaining fans. Global Spectrum Facility Management and John Labatt Centre staff were honoured that Tommy Hunter chose to close out his career at the John Labatt Centre, in the city where it all began 65 years ago at the age of nine. Prior to his final concert, the City of London held a special ceremony at City Hall to recognize his accomplishments and celebrate his magnificent career.

Tommy Hunter's final concert coincided with his 75th birthday and many of his friends and family were on hand to help him celebrate post show in Club Cambria where the Ovations staff made certain it was a night to remember.



COMMUNITY

Throughout the 2011-2012 season, Global Spectrum and Ovations staff at the John Labatt Centre were tremendously involved in the community through their donation of time and fundraising efforts.

In total, over \$125,000 worth of donations, goods and services went to a large number of local charities and community campaigns. These efforts have had a remarkable impact within London and Southwestern Ontario as in many cases premium tickets to events, including luxury suite donations, were able to generate significantly more dollars than the actual value.

During the 2011-2012 season, almost 1,000 tickets valued at over \$83,000 were donated and distributed throughout the community. Tickets utilized at silent auctions for a number of charities regularly produced figures much greater than face value. Over \$26,500 was paid out by Ovations to local not-for-profit organizations who worked the concession stands and another \$3,000 was given out through the giving of gift certificates.


Our tradition of fundraising during the NHL preseason game was upheld this year and we were very proud to donate over \$5,000.00 to the Canadian Tire Jumpstart program. Initiatives such as the 50-50 draw, battle of the sections and charitable auctions were utilized to help raise the money.

Our Group Sales Department raised \$7,500 over the year for local organizations through event sales.

Other charitable and community events supported include, Guts on Ice, a fundraising initiative for the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of Canada and multiple community clean ups. A new initiative this year included a Computer /Electronics Drop Off & Recycle event.



YOGA SHACK GIVES BACK



On July 17th the John Labatt Centre and Yoga Shack teamed up to create London's biggest yoga class in support of Mission Services of London. Two hundred people participated in a class for all levels including Mayor Joe Fontana, Labatt Brewery District Sales Manager Paul Walker and radio host "Taz" from FM 96. This event was born from the John Labatt Centre's healthy work place initiative in an effort to provide yoga to their full time staff. Over \$1600 was raised in support of Mission Services London whose focus is on serving those who struggle with poverty and homelessness.



ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DAY

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING DAY

On Saturday, June 2nd, the John Labatt Centre took part in Electronic Recycle day in partnership with Staples, BFI, the City of London and Recycleyourelectronics.ca. This was the first time that the venue and Global Spectrum staff had been involved with the event that encourages people to bring in their old electronics so that they can be properly recycled and not contaminate landfills. Members of the Operations department volunteered their time and were very successful as over two tons of equipment was dropped off at the John Labatt Centre.



COMMUNITY

ERENOC DEMAND PROGRAM

As part of the John Labatt Centre's green initiative, the venue has enrolled in the Ontario government's Enernoc Demand program. The Enernoc Demand response is our way of helping Ontario's power grid when it is under stress; we reduce power consumption by turning off our HVAC units, fridges and everything within the building that is non essential. During the 2011-2012 season we were asked to power down on four separate occasions and in total we were able to deliver 1357kw back to Ontario's power grid for an average performance rating of 113%.

CURBSIDE CARES

On Wednesday, June 6th the John Labatt Centre played host to the 16th Annual London Cares Curbside Food Drive Kickoff which served to educate and emphasize the need to build up the food supplies of the London Food Bank for the challenging summer months ahead. 

with our community and raising funds for


