


The survey was open from January 30 – February 8, 2013. A total of **1552 responses** were received.


#### What municipal ward do you live in?






#### To What Degree Do you Support the 0% Tax Increase Target?


#### Do you support increasing debt to maintain the 0%tax increase?




Do you support a 0%tax increase if there are service reductions?





Do you support the use of reserve (contingency) funding in order to achieve a 0%tax increase?




Do you support using all increased revenues from assessment growth (new tax revenue streams from new developments) to maintain a 0% tax increase?






#### What threshold are you comfortable with as a tax increase?




# In which areas do you think City Council should curtail the budget?









Redevelopment of London Hydro Lands








