Third, as a life long member of our London community, I would plan to support the ACAC in its areas of need as a means of paying forward all of the contributions of others prior to me.

I have also been fortunate for opportunities to volunteer with Dale Brain Injury Services and with TVCC. Both organizations have allowed me fantastic opportunities share my passion and experience in ways helpful to those in need.
