What do you hope to contribute or learn as part of a Community Advisory Committee? (max. 250 characters: I moved to London in 2012 and previously lived in Ancaster/Hamilton and Toronto. I have always been active within various disability communities and feel that I do not have that connection in London yet. I want to learn more about the City of London and how the Community Advisory Committees add to the cultural/social fabrics of the city as well as how I can bring my experience as a person who has lived with a life long disability (lived experience) and someone who has studied and has gained content experience and credibility (experiential knowledge) in how disability is constructed and shaped by policies and procedures, attitudes and perceptions and how individuals like myself often are not asked to add our knowledge to areas that directly impact us (e.g., Nothing About Us Without Us). I also enjoy learning from how others understand and view disability and accessibility and how that vision can be collectively strengthened and made inclusive.

How will you support the work of a Community Advisory Committee? (max. 250 characters): I am an open, considerate, and non-judgemental committee member. I understand tokenism, voice and how systems can silence and erase people. I am an expert in Equity, Justice, and Inclusion. In particular, my work centers on how ableism underpins and interlocks with all other systems of oppression. I value collective voice & action by working toward a common goal that includes voices from the mainstream but also hears the voices within the margins of the margins. For example, as a white physically disabled woman I understand that disabled BIPOC communities as well as disabled LGBTQ2S+communities and those who live with neurodiversity and cognitive/perceptual disabilities experience discrimination by mainstreamed accessibility and disability policies; or that these policies were created by particular minds and bodies and often narrowly fit communities impacted by intersectional challenges. I will bring attention to how an EDI lens broadens accessibility to more communities.

(max. 250 characters): I served on Accessibility Advisory Committees at U of T, McMaster, and now the Principal's Accessibility Advisory Committee at King's College @ UWO. I audited women's shelters for accessibility in Toronto and received a City of Toronto Community Service Award

(group recipient 2005) for developing accessible health education programs in high schools. I am an occupational therapist who specializes in anti-ableist, anti-oppressive practice and systems navigation. I understand how individuals with disabilities experience ableism and systemic oppression. I consult on academic ableism and support students as they navigate accessibility and accommodations within university and college environments. I appreciate how complex and nuanced accessibility issues are and how approaches, recommendations and solutions must include multiple perspectives. I try to understand the status quo and to advocate with marginalized individuals within the status quo, which may add to Advisory Committee goals.
