

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FIT Program allows Energy to be sold the Grid

- Ontario Feed-in Tariff "FIT" Program.
- Allows individuals to produce energy and sell it to the Grid.
- Hydro One to purchase kw's at a premium for 20yrs
- Premium is 30cents per kilowatt, fixed rate for 20yrs
- Current sold at apx.10cents per kilowatt.
- System sizes: Microfit up to 10kw (40 panels)
- Small FIT up to 500kw (2,000 panels)
- Large FIT up to 10 MegaWatts (400,000 panels)
